This half-day course explains the roll-out of Universal Credit - both 'natural migration' and 'managed migration'. It provides information on who can apply for Universal Credit, how claims may be made and how entitlement is actually calculated for single claimants, couples and families. Universal Credit: Managed Migration	Civic Centre	Microsoft Teams
Managed Migration is the process through which people who remain on 'legacy benefits' will be expected to move on to Universal Credit. It is understood that claimants of 'legacy benefits' living in Wolverhampton will start to receive 'migration notices' at some point after the New Year. Under Universal Credit, claimants (and their partners) are expected to agree a 'claimant commitment' which sets out the work-focused interview, work preparation,	2 nd April 2025 1.30 pm to 4.30 pm	ТВА
work search and/or work availability requirements upon which their claim will be dependent. This course examines these, so called, 'work-related requirements' and provides information on the sanctions which can be imposed when people fail to meet them. Courses are now being held face-to- face at the Civic Centre.		

	WCA:	Universal	Credit	and	ESA
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This half-day course examines the operation of the 'Work Capability Assessment' - the tool which determines who may be treated as being too sick to work (i.e. those who have 'limited capability for work' and 'limited capability for work-related activity'), for Universal Credit / ESA purposes. Those who complete the UC50 and ESA50 forms will benefit from this course. The options available to those who are found 'fit for work' will be discussed.

Personal Independence Payment

This half-day course provides information on the basic qualifying conditions for Personal Independence Payment and highlights the disability-related qualifying conditions which govern entitlement to the 'daily living component' and 'mobility component'. The course explains how claims may be made and how people may challenge / dispute unfavourable decisions.

Form Filling: PIP2

This half-day course is designed to provide useful information and 'good practice' tips on completing the PIP2 'How your disability affects you' form. The course also examines the implications of failing to complete this particular form when asked to do so.

Benefits and Work

This half-day course provides details of how benefits can be affected by work and what benefits may be accessed by those in work. In particular, it seeks to explain how Universal Credit is calculated for those in work situations. It also examines what happens if someone is working but then becomes too sick to work.

Benefits and Young People

This half-day course is designed to specifically highlight the circumstances in which young people can apply for Universal Credit when unemployed, too sick to work, working and/or in education. It also looks at the situation of young carers and young mums. By use of case studies, it shows how much people can expect to get by way of Universal Credit when entitled.

Benefits training...

Benefits and Older People

This half-day course is aimed at those working with and advising older people. It examines the key differences between State Retirement Pension and the New State Pension. It explains eligibility to Pension Credit (including the position of mixed age couples) and the potential amounts paid. Also examined will be the rules surrounding entitlement to Attendance Allowance and Carer's Allowance.

Benefits and Disabled Children

This half-day course examines entitlement to Disability Living Allowance for children (children aged under 16) who may need help with their personal care and/or mobility due to disability. It looks at when extra amounts may be awarded to families with a disabled child under Universal Credit. It also examines the benefits available to carers of disabled children.

Benefits and People from Abroad

This half-day course explains the situations in which people coming to the United Kingdom from abroad may be able to claim Social Security benefits. The main focus of the course will be the examination of the rights of EEA nationals who are living, looking for work, working or studying in the United Kingdom in the wake of Brexit.

DWP Social Fund: Grants and Loans

This half-day course is designed to provide an overview of the rules surrounding the Sure Start Maternity Grant, Funeral Expenses Payment, Budgeting Loan and Short-term Benefit Advance provisions. It also highlights the system that exists which is designed to help new claimants of Universal Credit who have insufficient means to make ends meet before they are due to get their first payment of Universal Credit.

Welfare Reform

This half-day course examines some of the key benefit reforms which have been introduced under recent welfare reform measures including the benefit cap, bedroom tax and two child limit. The course looks at the impact these reforms can have on individuals as well as looking at how they impact on the Wolverhampton economy.

This half-day course explains how benefit decisions may be challenged by 'mandatory reconsideration' and 'appeal'. It looks at the processes and time limits involved. It explains what happens when disputes go to appeal before a First-tier Tribunal and how decisions are reached by such tribunals.

Free and Fee-Paying Places: You will not have to pay for a place on a course if you work or volunteer for the City of Wolverhampton Council or a voluntary or charitable organisation working with people living in Wolverhampton. If this does not apply, then the fee is £150.00 per place on the one-day Introduction to Benefits course and £95.00 per place on any of our half-day courses. If you need to pay for the training, then when making your booking can you include details of any relevant Purchase Order number and details of the person to whom any invoice needs to be sent if that person is not you.

Training Materials and Certificates:

Each course is supported by a detailed set of Information Guide / Fact Sheet training materials covering the themes and topics covered on the course. Those attending will also receive a pdf copy of the PowerPoint slideshow supporting the course in question. Moreover, participants will get a certificate confirming their attendance on the course.

Cancellations:

We expect course participants to let us know in good time if they are unable to attend. This will enable us to offer their place to other people who might wish to attend. Should the course be cancelled for any reason, we would look to let participants know as soon as is practicable.

IMPORTANT: Please be aware that due to the demand for places on our courses and the limited availability, if a booking is made for a person who then fails to attend without a period of reasonable prior notice, then if they are feepaying we reserve the right to charge them the full fee for their place and if they are not fee paying to charge the organisation that they represent, **30% of the course fee** (i.e. £28.50 for a half day course and £45.00 for a full-day course) irrespective of whether the course is held online or it is one of our face-to-face courses.
