#### Request:

In the years 2010/11, 2012/13, 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16,

 A record of whom you have commissioned to deliver drug and alcohol treatment, and what service was provided. (Please specify any instances of residential rehabilitation in the data).

In respect of your above question, it has been established after careful consideration that the Council does not hold the above information relating to the years 2010/11 and 2012/2013 as Public Health responsibilities transferred from the NHS to Local Government from April 2013. We also do not hold the details of organisations that City of Wolverhampton Council have directly commissioned to deliver services during this period. We are therefore informing you as required by Section 1(1) (a) of the Act, that states:
