We will still maintain through high needs funding 1 primary and 1 secondary provision. Both these

schools are now academies and discussion around planned places has taken place.

- The primary provision will continue to be funded for 24 places.
- The secondary placement has been funded for 19 but actual attendance of 3 places for last 2 years therefore places for 6 has been agreed from April 2017.

The LA has reviewed its planned places in its resource bases.

- Those children accessing 3 year grant funding with severe or profound HI will access the Inclusion fund with evidence through a specialist teachers report.
- The weekly playgroup based at The Gem centre provides a multiagency group for parents
- · Family signing groups for parents are organised through the centrally funded deaf tutor.
- The service continue to organise after school activities to provide deaf peer support.
- Specialist service currently support;
 - 72 children/young people with EHCP
 - 176 non EHCP
