

Response to Request for Information

Taxi Licence

Request:

This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Please send me the following information:

Since 1st August 2015:

- 1. The number of new and renewed taxi (Hackney Carriage) licenses you have granted?.
 - 436 Hackney Carriage Vehicle licences granted since 01 August 2015.
- 2. The number of new and renewed Private Hire Vehicle (PHV) licenses you have granted?
 - 6013 Private Hire Vehicles licences granted since 01 August 2015.
- 3. The number of taxi licences granted to drivers with criminal convictions? Unfortunately, City of Wolverhampton Council cannot supply the information you requested for the reasons set out below. Section 17 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires City of Wolverhampton Council, when refusing to provide such information (because the information is exempt) to provide you, the applicant with a notice which:
 - (a) states the fact.
 - (b) specifies the exemption in question and
 - (c) states (if that would not otherwise be apparent) why the exemption applies:

In relation to your particular request, the following exemption applies:

Section 12 - Exemption where cost of compliance exceeds appropriate limit

We can confirm that the Council holds information falling within the description specified in your request. However, Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 allows a public authority to refuse a request if the cost of providing the information to the applicant would exceed the 'appropriate limit' as defined by the Freedom of Information.

The Regulations provide that the appropriate limit to be applied to requests received by local authorities is £450 (equivalent to 18 hours of work). In estimating the cost of complying with a request for information, an authority can only take into account any reasonable costs incurred in:

- (a) Determining whether it holds the information,
- (b) Locating the information, or a document which may contain the information,
- (c) Retrieving the information, or a document which may contain the information,

and

(d) Extracting the information from a document containing it.

For the purposes of the estimate the costs of performing these activities should be estimated at a rate of £25 per hour.

The information appertaining to this question we can confirm this is not easily accessible and as such this information is not held as a distinct set able to be retrieved or reported on. To get the information would require a full scale look into all records. This would be a manual exercise and as such we believe that the aggregated time it would take to collate the information would be in excess of 18 hours (equivalent to a notional cost of £450).

4. The number of PHV licenses granted to drivers with criminal convictions. In the cases of those convicted?
