My questions are:

- 1). It appears from this document: http://www.wolverhampton.gov.uk/CHttpHandler.ashx?id=6768&p=0 that some of these contracts ended last year, and other documents appear to show that extensions were previously granted to the original agreements, and potentially extended again - is this correct - what are the latest contract end dates? See our responses provided above.
- 2). How are contract extensions (specific to the above) given justification with regards to 'Value for Money' and is there an audit trail documenting these decisions available? We assess each contract as it comes up or expiry depending on a number of factors eg., future commissioning strategy, supply market, price benchmarking, quality of service delivery etc.
- 3). Who specifically makes these decisions to extend these particular contracts (person and/ or department)?

 These decisions are made in line with the Council's constitution.
- 4). When do you intend to re-tender these contracts and how do you plan on carrying this out. Specifically, will you be entering into a Framework, or since it appears as some of the contracts are above the EU tendering Threshold, will you be submitting competitive tendering?
