## Drug and alcohol services

## Request:

Could you please provide the following:

The council's total budget for drug and alcohol services in each of the financial years 2011/12, 2012/13, 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16, 2016/17 and 2017/18. In respect of your above question, it has been established after careful consideration that the Council does not hold the above information relating to the years 2010-2011 and 2012-2013 as Public Health responsibilities transferred from the NHS to Local Government from April 2013. We are therefore informing you as required by Section 1(1) (a) of the Act, that states:

"Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request".

However, City of Wolverhampton Council can provide you with responses for 2013-2014 onwards with regard to Public Health commissioned services as follows:
