Contraceptive Services

Request:

Request 1:

- Please state the budget allocated (as opposed to outturn) by your local authority for the
 - (a) financial year 2017/18 and The sexual health budget allocated for 2017/18 was £2,875,350.
 - (b) financial year 2018/19 for all sexual and reproductive health services (please give combined budget if within a block contract). This includes services commissioned via GPs and pharmacists.

 The sexual health budget allocated for 2018/19 is £2,649,830.

Request 2:

- Please state the budget allocated by your local authority for
 - (a) financial year 2017/18, and
 - (b) financial year 2018/19 for
 - (i) contraception,
 - (ii) GUM services and
 - (iii) HIV prevention.
 - Please do state if your sexual and reproductive health services are integrated and you are unable to separate spend. In respect of question 2, it has been established after careful consideration that the Council does not hold the above information as the sexual and reproductive health services are integrated therefore we are unable to separate spend.

Consequently, we are unable to provide any information relating to the above, and are informing you as required by Section 1(1) (a) of the Act, that states:

"Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request".

Request 3:

- Please provide the number of sites commissioned by your local authority, or a provider sub-contracted by your local authority, to deliver contraceptive services in
 - (a) the financial year 2015/16,
 - (b) the financial year 2016/17,
 - (c) the financial year 2017/18 and
 - (d) plans for the financial year 2018/19.

In respect of question 3, it has been established after careful consideration that the Council does not hold the above information as the model that has been commissioned is a hub and spoke model focusing on expanding the local community offer in areas where the epidemiology identifies additional need. Sites were not specified by the local authority apart from a main central location where the provider chooses to deliver changes according to levels of utilisation.

Consequently, we are unable to provide any information relating to the above, and are informing you as required by Section 1(1) (a) of the Act, that states:
