Take-Home Naloxone

Request:

I submit this request for specific information regarding Take-home Naloxone (THN) provision in the City of Wolverhampton Council area of responsibility.

This information is sought under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

5. Please briefly describe any initiatives (particularly peer-driven initiatives) that have been implemented to improve access to take-home naloxone in the local authority area?

Six Naloxone workshops have been provided for community agencies including all P3 hostels, West Midlands Travel, Solace, Service User Involvement Team, city centre ambassadors and Navigator with a total of 49 staff attending. A Naloxone pack will be given to all hostels that attended training to put in their first aid boxes in order for them to use if needed. Further workshops are planned over the year.
