## Blue Badge

#### **Request:**

Please could you answer the questions below about your local authority's policies on Blue Badges and the number of applicants your authority receives for Blue Badges?

#### **Blue Badge applications**

- How many Blue Badge <u>applications</u> has your local authority received in 2017? Please include all Blue Badge applicants (not just those with Parkinson's). 3,061
- 2. Of these Blue Badge applications in 2017, please can you tell us:
  - a. How many were rejected? 37
  - How many were issued as a passported benefit from Personal Independence Payments/ Disability Living Allowance awards? Moving around - PIP – 377 Higher Rate Mobility Component of DLA – 1038
- 3. How many rejected Blue Badge applications resulted in an appeal (or request to review the decision), and how many appeals or reviews were successful? We received 8 appeals for 2017 of which:
  - 2 successful
  - 6 unsuccessful
- Do you record how many of those applications were from people living with Parkinson's or another neurological condition? No

  - With reference to your above question, your request for information has now been considered and the City of Wolverhampton Council is not obliged to supply the information you requested for the reasons set out below.

Section 17 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires City of Wolverhampton Council, when refusing to provide such information (because the information is exempt) to provide you, the applicant with a notice which:

- (a) states the fact,
- (b) specifies the exemption in question and
- (c) states (if that would not otherwise be apparent) why the exemption applies:

In relation to your particular request, the following exemption applies:

# Section 12 - Exemption where cost of compliance exceeds appropriate limit

We can confirm that the Council holds information falling within the description specified in your request. However, Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 allows a public authority to refuse a request if the cost of providing the information to the applicant would exceed the 'appropriate limit' as defined by the Freedom of Information.

The Regulations provide that the appropriate limit to be applied to requests received by local authorities is £450 (equivalent to 18 hours of work). In estimating the cost of complying with a request for information, an authority can only take into account any reasonable costs incurred in:

(a) Determining whether it holds the information,

(b) Locating the information, or a document which may contain the information,

(c) Retrieving the information, or a document which may contain the information,

and

(d) Extracting the information from a document containing it.

For the purposes of the estimate the costs of performing these activities should be estimated at a rate of £25 per hour.

The information appertaining to your request is not easily accessible and as such this information is not held as a distinct set able to be retrieved or reported on. To give you a bit more understanding, parking charges for Disabled Blue badge holders were introduced on city centre car parks prior to 1979 and our electronic records start from 2004. Therefore, to get this information would require a full-scale look into all paper records. This would involve searching for the relevant Committee that held responsibility for fees and charges for cark parks which would be stored in our Archives. This would be a manual exercise and as such we believe that the aggregated time it would take to collate the information would be in excess of 18 hours (equivalent to a notional cost of £450).

d. If these charges apply to on-street or off-street parking, or both? Disabled parking is chargeable on 17 city centre off-street car parks and disabled parking is free of charge on 24 city wide off-street car parks

Disabled blue badge holders can park free of charge when parked in onstreet disable parking bays and On-Street Pay & Display bays.

6. What guidance are decision makers using when deciding eligibility for Blue Badges? Please include a copy in your response. We attach the Pro formas which are used at Desk Based Assessment stage and Mobility Assessment Stage. The criteria which is applied to all applications is set by The Department of Transport and has been interpreted locally into the two types of eligibility criteria taken directly from The Department of Transport:

#### The 'eligible without further assessment' criteria

People who may be issued with a badge without further assessment are those who are more than two years old and fall within one or more of the following descriptions:

• Receives the Higher Rate of the Mobility Component of the Disability Living Allowance (HRMCDLA); or

• Receives 8 points or more under the "moving around" activity of the mobility component of Personal Independence Payment (PIP); or

- · Is registered blind (severely sight impaired); or
- Receives a War Pensioner's Mobility Supplement (WPMS); or

• Has been both awarded a lump sum benefit at tariffs 1-8 of the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme and certified as having a permanent and substantial disability which causes inability to walk or very considerable difficulty in walking.

(NOTE: Armed Forces Independence Payment (AFIP) awards are not included in the Type 1 eligibility criteria.

#### Detailed guidance on proof of entitlement

Provided that the applicant can demonstrate that they satisfy one of the criteria listed above, and can satisfy identity and residency checks, the DfT expects badges to be issued with the minimum of formality in these cases.

Consideration is given if multiple badges have been received in the past. Diagnosis, prognosis and treatment interventions are also considered. When individuals do not meet this criteria they are then forwarded for further assessment. This assessment is completed by an Occupational Therapist who completes a mobility assessment under the Department of transport criteria.
