I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information from Wolverhampton City Council.

1. In the past five years, have you cancelled, curtailed, or introduced charging for any rubbish uplift service including, but not limited to Christmas Trees and bulky items? If so please provide details?

For each of the past five years, please provide an estimate for how many Christmas Trees the council or its contractors have had to remove from streets and other public spaces and the cost associated with said removals? The only Christmas tree specific data that Amey have on record is from January 2015 and 2016. This is because the winter garden waste collections were still in operation in the previous years and residents deposited trees in their garden waste bin for collection.
